The primary accomplishment of this praise is that through it His Great Name will be exalted and sanctified from all worlds.

(Yesod V'Shoresh Ha Avodah)

The primary intent should be that His Name should be whole and His throne should be whole. that The Holv One, Blessed is He, should eradicate the memory of Amalek, and that His Name should be sanctified in all the worlds forever and ever. (based on Tur,

Orach Chalm Ch. 56)



Therefore, it is found in the writings of the ARIzal that when answering, "Amen, Yehei Shemei Rabba", one should accept upon himself selfsacrifice, for through this service of self-sacrifice, His Great Name will be exulted and sanctified in all the worlds more and MOTE. (Yesod V'Shoresh i la'Avoada)

Focusing your eyes on the words "Amen, Yehei Shmei Rabba" as you say them is a powerful way to inspire the proper kavannah.

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This card was designed to be affixed to the inside of your siddur as a means to improve your concentration and Kavano when answering Amen.

"At the time that the people of Israel enter the synagogues and houses of study and respond in the Kaddish, 'May His great Name be Blessee The Holy One, blessed is He, shakes His head and says: Fortunate is the King who is praised this way in His house, What is there for the Father Who has exiled His sons, and woe to the sons, who have been exiled from their Father's table." [Berachos 3a]
