

A lady's **Avagolf** knit outfit was brought to the Lee Avenue Shatnez Laboratory for testing. Its contents label listed 100% Cotton. Testing revealed that it was mislabeled and it was, in fact 50% Wool, 50% Linen!

The customer was shocked because she had worn it for the Yomim Noraim and the entire winter.

Garments that are 100% Cotton do not require testing. However, tweed, textured and multicolored fabrics should be tested anyway. They may contain wool and linen and be intrinsically shatnez even if no wool and linen is "officially" listed on its content label.

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
