

Linen Scraps in Children's Coats



Shatnez was discovered in a child's wool-blend winter coat. This coat is currently sold in a store called The Children's Place.

Brand Name: Place [Finest Quality Outerwear Ltd. Edition No 915] The contents label lists: 57% Polyester 40% Wool 3% Other Fibers Country of Origin: China

Shatnez: A bridge is a scrap of material that is used to connect two components. The bridge connecting the fabric lining to the outer shell in this coat was linen (see picture).

The lesson is: Though this coat does not have shoulder pads it still had shatnez. This explains why all, wool articles of clothing should be checked for shatnez.

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
